## Potential Teacher Strike Day – Monday 12 November

Our union NZEI is delighted the Prime Minister announced that the Government will fully fund the equivalent of 600 Learning Support Coordinator (LSC) positions in 2020.

This is a big win for children, for teachers and for principals. Having a funded LSC/SENCO position in every school is a core claim in our *Kua Tae Te Wā* campaign. The Government has promised further sector engagement in the rollout of the design and implementation of this commitment.

This announcement signals a positive start to the week of facilitation with the Ministry over primary teacher and principal collective agreements. The Chief of the Employment Relations Authority, James Crichton, who can make recommendations about next steps, will conduct facilitation. The parties do not have to follow the recommendations, but they must consider them.

While yesterday's announcement is good news, no new offers are on the table yet to address either pay or time. The upcoming rolling strikes are therefore proceeding still.

By the end of the week, information will be sent to all families as to whether or not the planned strike scheduled for Monday 12 November will be on or called off. In the meanwhile, as a safeguard, Kelly Club is making provision for a one-day programme and information will be going home with your eldest child today.
