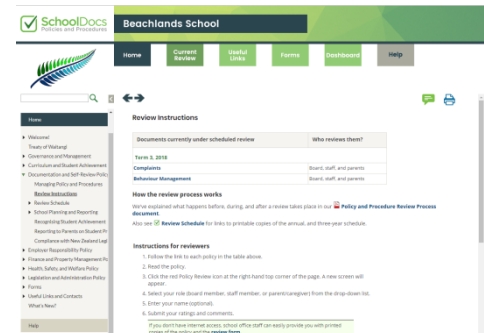
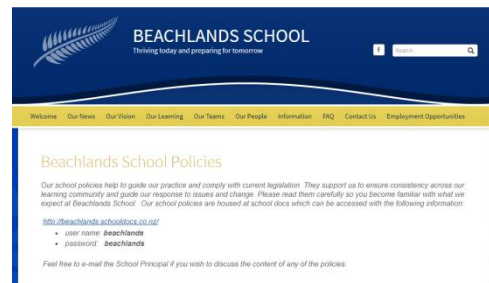
Beachlands School Policies

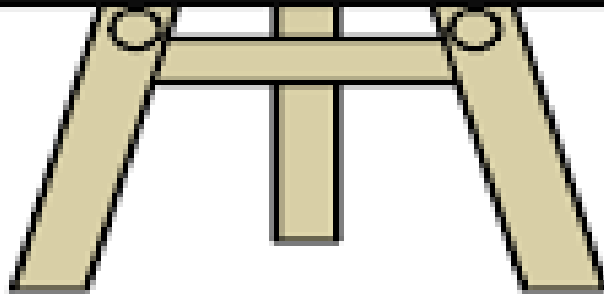

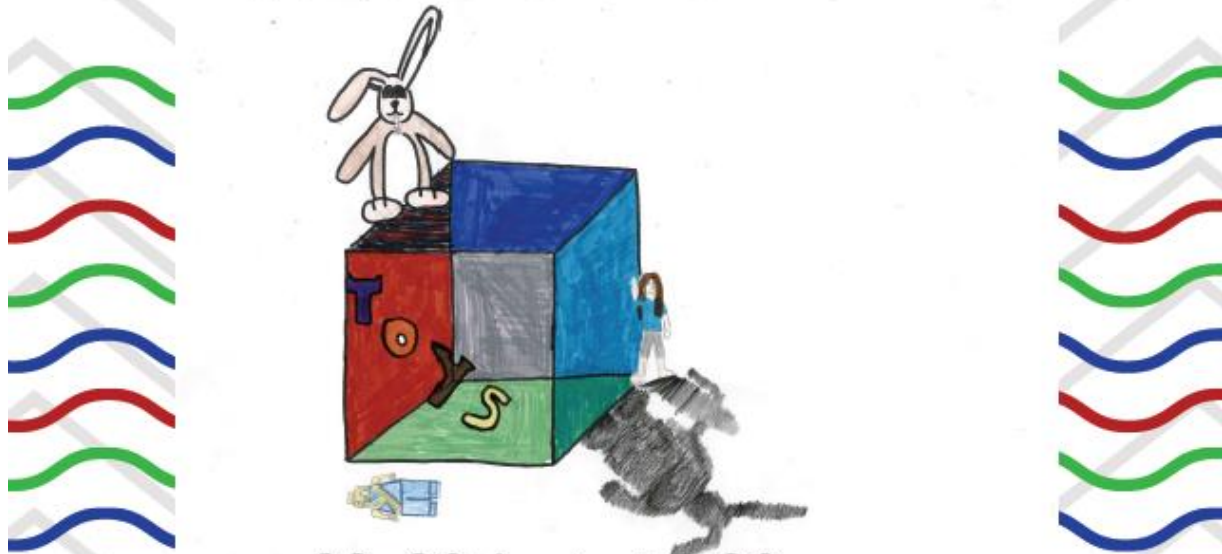
