### Food Bank Drive - Monday 25 March to Thursday 28 March 2024

During the week leading up to Easter, our school is holding a foodbank drive for the Takutai Trust and the Pohutukawa Coast Food Bank. This ensures any families taking an early Easter break have the opportunity to bring in needed items to support our local community.

To ensure we get a range of food for our food banks, we have made the following suggestions for each team:

- ★ Koru Team (Years' 0 & 1) Lunchbox fillers i.e. muesli bars, fruit roll ups, crackers, biscuits.
- ★ Nikau Team (Year 2) practical household items i.e. tea towels (brand new), dishwashing liquid, clothes washing detergent.
- ★ Totara Team (Years' 3 & 4) breakfast items including cereal, coffee, tea bags, spreads for toast.
- **Rimu Team (Years' 5 & 6)** Dinner items i.e. pasta, pasta sauce, rice.
- ★ Kauri Team (Years' 7 & 8) Canned goods i.e. baked beans, spaghetti, canned fruit and vegetables


### **Beachlands Bookworms**

Ensuring you have the correct child under **Student Name**, select the details of the absence from the drop downs. *Note you will need to complete a separate notification for each child.* 

After clicking **SEND**, wait for the success message before closing the app. The information then gets sent directly to our absentees team in the office. Too easy!



There is a proposal for a Franklin targeted rate to create a fund to be used within the Franklin area to construct paths and trails that are unlikely to be built by Auckland Council (AC) or Auckland Transport.

AC currently have no regional plans to fund paths and trails in Franklin - that's the reality.

The proposal is for a \$1 a week, \$52 a year rate for Franklin.
