## From our Acting Principal - Mrs Bronwyn Harrison

The weeks are going so quickly and it is hard to believe we are already halfway through the term! As I move around the school I am always so proud of how polite our students are. They are always ready with a smile and a warm greeting. I love hearing their stories about things they are learning about and experiencing both at school and at home. Relationships are key to our tamariki learning, and finding ways to connect with each of our students is always a high priority for our teachers. If there are things going on at home that you think might be having an impact on your child's learning please drop your child's teacher a quick email. Teachers will always let you know if they have concerns or if something happens at school that they think you should be aware of. Reminding your child to let their teacher know if something happens on the playground rather than waiting for when they get home is also important!

#### **Attendance**

Last year the government announced a regular attendance target of 80% of students to be present at school for more than 90% of the school year. As you know, regular attendance makes it more likely for students to be able to succeed at school, stay on track with their academic journey and to feel confident socially, building positive relationships with teachers and peers.

Four attendance categories were developed to help you understand how frequently your children attend school.

Concerning/Irregular attendance	70% attendance	Average 14 days absent a term

Our Beachlands School data for Term 1 showed that 74% of our students had Good/Regular attendance (90% or above) with extra holidays being a significant reason for absences. We encourage you to let us know if there are other circumstances that are making it difficult for you to get your child to school so that we can work with you to ensure that they are attending.

Lateness can also be an issue and in Term 1, 75% of our students were regularly on time to school. As the winter months approach the Ministry of Education has published the following information to help you know if your child is well enough to be at school.

We continue to work to ensure that all of our students attend school regularly and arrive at school on time, and will follow up with families where necessary.

Over the last 6 months, we have been busy growing native seedlings ready to be planted. On Monday 19 May we did just that!! 28 children and our parent helpers drove to Waiomanu Farm in Maraetai. We had a fabulous day and planted 515 of the 787 native trees that we grew, the remainder will be planted by the farm owners and the trust. It was a beautiful day after a huge night of rain. ### **Kauri Technology Update**

This term in the Technology room we have started Food Technology, where we are mostly focusing on dishes from New Zealand. In keeping with the New Zealand theme, we wanted to commemorate ANZAC day and made some Turkish food; hummus and bazlama (a flat bread made with yoghurt). We've tried some microwave hacks to make pavlova, and we have also followed a traditional Māori recipe to make Kanga Waru (steamed corn pudding), a delicious dessert! And to top it off we've been able to wear our one of a kind, self designed and sewn aprons while cooking!

#### Free Dental Care

Free dental care is available for children from birth to their 18th birthday. This includes dental examinations and x-rays, preventative treatments and treatment of dental caries, which may include fillings. Dental treatment is provided by different dental providers depending on a child's age. The Dental Service that Beachlands School is in zone for operates out of **Shelly Park School**, **13 Sunnyview Avenue**, **Howick**. Please contact them directly on **534-5682** to make a booking.

It is important for carers to visit the clinic with their children to support the development of good oral health habits while they are young. Remember, dental decay is entirely preventable by having a good diet, brushing and flossing twice a day, avoiding sugary drinks and drinking water and milk.

There is enough fluoride in toothpaste, food and water for most children to receive adequate fluoride intake, but if parents are concerned, or your child has being given a high risk assessment please discuss these concerns with your Dental Therapist.






